WTP

- -The list for the 20 sites for lead and copper testing will be done this week.
- -The deadline for the CCR is July 1, 2019. It has been published on the Village website as of June 10th, a hard copy has been posted in the Village office and Scio Post Office. An add will run in the local paper for June 15th. The Village web site address will be listed on the water bills for residents to see the 2018 CCR.
- -Hydrant flushing will continue for the Village on Thursdays in May through October. We have noticed that the hydrants have cleared up quickly since the use of the OPO4 and consistent flushing in each section of the Village.

WWTP

- -The VA and ORC are in discussion on the new weirs and chain for the clairifier building at the WWTP. This will be needed in 2019.
- -A portable generator is required by 2021 for the lift stations on East College St and Eastport St. The VA has contacted the SEDO for additional information on the specific size and requirements for the generator. Recommend the council allocate funds for a purchase in late 2020 to allow adequate time update any electrical requirements that are needed to implement a portable generator

RCAP/ORWA

- -Mr. Thompson is scheduled for a RCAP field day June 13th. Topics covered will be leak detection, valve exercise, and directional flushing among other items. Additional training events may be available late spring and summer.
- -June 21st and June 26th the VA will be attending utility oversight and sustainability training.

Capital Improvement Projects

-OPWC grant award for the Phase II water line project is as follows: Grant award is \$86,940: Loan amount is \$86,940: Village expense is \$45,000. Total Project cost is \$218,880. The application for the ARC portion for additional grant funds has been submitted to the OMEGA for the first round for consideration, I anticipate a response for round one consideration for the ARC portion in July 2019.

Roadways/ Equipment/ Buildings-

- -The DuraPatcher this is an ongoing process; we have made some good progress at this stage of the year.
- -The WWTP and clarifier building roofs will be replaced this spring. The cost to the Village will be materials only, the labor will be from the community service program
- -The old Village building has been cleaned out, the Village is prepared to proceed with the final sale of the building. Deed was signed June 11th.
- -SR646 and East College Street intersection: Harrison County ODOT has agreed to supply manpower and oversight for the drainage issue at this intersection. The Village would be liable for all costs associated with material and supply some labor. The earliest that this can be done is September 2019.
- A finish mower has been placed on order for the large tractor, estimated cost is \$3500.00

General:

- -Mosquito spraying is scheduled with Action Now. The dates are as follows: June 11th: July 2nd: Aug 6th (subject to change) and Sept 10th. These dates have been published on the Village website
- -Fencing around the lift stations and well #2 at the water plant, this will be scheduled to be completed this summer.
- -Vacant, unkempt, and dilapidated properties
- -The Falcon Pipeline update is located in your packet
- -One additional worker for the summer has been hired by the Village to work two days a week.
- -Mike Conrad, inquired about the old generator at the WWTP, he was informed that the council would be addressed again on his behalf.

Scio Village Council met in regular session on May 22, 2019 at 6 pm with Mayor Michelle Carpenter presiding and leading the Pledge to the Flag. Members present were Erin Thompson, Ron Wright, Andrew Turner, Carol Davy, Heidi Trice and Betty Gotschall. Others included Water/WW Adm. & Income Tax Clerk Janeen Scott, Clerk-Treasurer Trish Copeland and Village Administrator Jason Tubaugh.. J.D. Long of the News-Herald was in attendance.

Turner moved to approve minutes from the previous meeting as presented and Trice seconded; all present voted yes. Motion carried.

Water/WW & Income Tax

Scott reported that water meter installation with the present stock has been completed. Also, Income Tax collections are up over 2018's at this time in the year.

Clerk-Treasurer

Copeland told the group the latest bridge report has arrived from ODOT and is available on the table for anyone interested in seeing it.

The final audit report has been completed and can be viewed on ohioauditor.gov.

Water/Income Tax

Council was apprised that as of today 123 new meters have been installed. The only issues have been with the Kamstrup software and its inability to mesh with our computer system.

Scott has been disappointed with the lack of response from our solicitor pertaining to needed paperwork from taxpayers and incorrect income tax filings for 2018.

Mayor

Carpenter asked if council is interested in signing up for NEW Build info from the census. Thompson moved, seconded by Trice that Scio participate. Roll call: Thompson, yea, Trice, yea; Wright, yea; Davy, yea, Gotschall, yea; Turner, yea. Motion carried.

The Mayor passed out the email received by Attorney Felgenhauer from Harrison Hills Schools. Several remarked that they felt the school board had not complied with Ohio Revised Code.

Village Administrator

Tubaugh opened by lamenting at the number of properties around town that have not been mowed and resulting in trash and high grass at many houses. Attorney Felgenhauer said he will explore the options available to the village. One thought was to have the village mow and clean and add to the property tax bills.

WTP

- -The list for the 20 sites for lead and copper testing are being reviewed by the OEPA SEDO, once they are approved the testing will start.
- -The deadline for the CCR is July 1, 2019. It will be published IAW OEPA regulations.
- -Hydrant flushing for the Village will be on Thursdays in May through October

WWTP

- -The discharge permit for the WWTP is still pending. The VA spoke with the OEPA SEDO representative on May 21st, the Village is in compliance with all rules and regulations for discharge from the WWTP.
- The T-6 pump and new control panel are working well, no issues to date

-A portable generator is required by 2021 for the lift stations on East College St and Eastport St, the VA and ORC have been working with several contacts to obtain pricing information.

OFPA

Financial Implementation of an Asset Management Plan via webinar was completed by the VA. It was held on the following dates: April 30th, May 7th, and May 14th from 10-11am. Mr. Tubaugh suggests all council members avail themselves of this tool when it becomes available again.

RCAP/ORWA

-Mr. Thompson is scheduled for a RCAP field day June 13th, topics covered will be leak detection, valve exercise, and directional flushing among other items.

Additional training events may be available late spring and summer.

Capital Improvement Projects

-The Village <u>has been awarded</u> the grant application for Phase II water line capital improvement project through OPWC. The ARC portion is the next step in receiving additional funding for this project. Project is slated for 2020. Mayor Carpenter thanked Jake for his efforts in making this possible for Scio.

Roadways/ Equipment/ Buildings-

- -The DuraPatcher this is an ongoing process, it is ongoing and we have made some good progress at this stage of the year.
- -The WWTP and clarifier building roofs will be replaced this spring. The cost to the Village will be materials only, the labor will be from the community service program.

General:

-Mosquito spraying is scheduled with Action Now. The dates are as follows: June 2nd: July 2nd: Aug 6th (subject to change) and Sept 10th. These dates have been published on the Village website

- -The summer youth program will commence in May and June. The Village will receive two youths for the season. One will start May 28th and the other is June 3rd.
- -Community Service. The VA has agreed to assist several individuals that have community service to work with the Village to meet their obligations.

Tubaugh wanted council to know that since it was ODOT who granted the permits for the heavy oil and gas industry loads to travel over Scio's infrastructure, he has contacted them several times about the standing water at the SR 646 and Main St. intersection.

OLD BUSINESS

Ms. Thompson asked for a Park Committee Meeting to be held soon. July 8th is the auction for playground equipment from Harrison Hills Schools. It was agreed the committee will meet on May 29th at 4 pm at the village offices.

Betty Gotschall inquired as to any further information we might have received from Attorney Cory Phillips. Trish said she had spoken with him on May 16th. Cory feels that Mr. Matthews should continue for the village – depending on what work Matthews has already done for the village. Attorney Phillips said he has emailed both Matthews and *his* boss, a Mr. Dubliak, inquiring as to the standing of Scio's chance of annexation of any property. Cory will continue to stay in touch with Jake Tubaugh should if there are any further developments.

NEW BUSINESS

Turner said he had been asked if the village is planning any festivities for July 4th. He was told no and a discussion ensued as to what "used to be". In the past, the village had no ties to July 4th other than supplying the park area.

Ms. Thompson made a motion to enter Executive Session for Park to discuss possible legal issues – this was seconded by Mr. Thompson at approx. 6:30 pm. Roll call: Thompson, yea; Turner, yea; Gotschall, yea; Wright, yea; Davy, yea; Trice, yea. Motion carried. At approx. 6:40 pm Trice moved to exit the session and Ms. Thompson seconded. Roll call: Thompson, yea; Wright, yea; Turner, yea; Trice, yea; Davy, yea; Gotschall, yea; motion carried.

Mr. Felgenhauer said Section 93.40 of the Ohio Basic Code covers a landowner cleaning up property and/or the village doing it and assessing the tax bill. He asks that pictures of the nuisance areas and a picture be kept to document the complaints.

Wright moved to approve the Financial Report and Thompson seconded. Roll call: Thompson, yea; Turner, yea; Gotschall, yea; Wright, yea; Davy, yea; Trice, yea. Motion carried.

Trice moved to pay the bills as presented and seconded by Davy. Roll call reflected: Thompson, yea; Wright, yea; Turner, yea; Trice, yea; Gotschall, yea; Davy, yea; motion carried.

As there was no further business Thompson moved to adjourn the meeting.

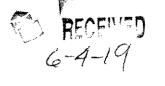

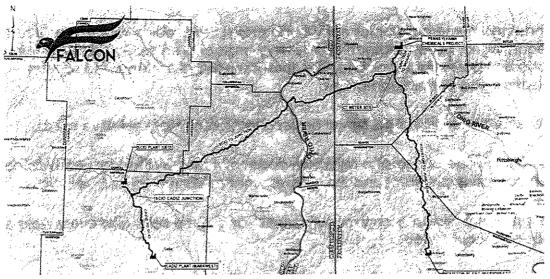

#### BUILDING NEW AND RELIABLE INFRASTRUCTURE

Shell Pipeline will build, own and operate the Falcon Ethane Pipeline System, a 97-mile common carrier ethane pipeline which will be located in Southwestern Pennsylvania, West Virginia and Fastern Ohio.

The Falcon Pipeline will connect three major ethane source points: Houston, Pa., Scio, Ohio and Cadiz, Ohio, in the rich gas portions of the Marcellus and Utica shale reservoirs.

After a rigorous evaluation of competitive bids, Shell Pipeline awarded the construction contract to Minnesota Limited, a union contractor. The decision was based on economic drivers, safety record, and technical performance.

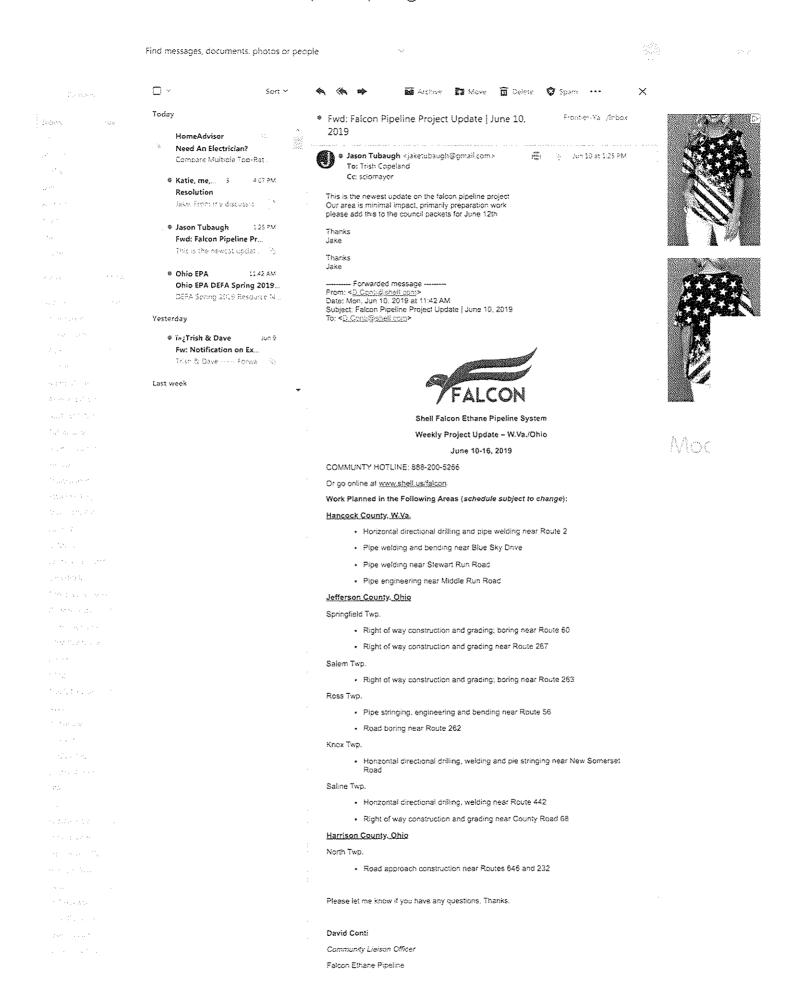

- ✓ All pipe, which will be buried at a minimum depth of 4 feet, is rated for nearly twice the expected operating pressure, and three times what's needed on HDD sections.
- ✓ The pipe is pressure-tested during manufacturing and in the field, and every weld is X-rayed or automatic ultrasonic tested.
- ✓ Pipeline integrity is maintained through cathodic protection, 24/7 electronic monitoring and right of way inspections by ground and air.
- ✓ Warning ribbon is buried 2 feet above the pipe to prevent third-party strikes.
- √ Valves were located to optimize emergency response and can be operated remotely from a
  24/7, state-of-the-art response center.
- Ongoing emergency response planning and training will be conducted with local and county first-responders and managers.
- ✓ Right of way restoration will focus on vegetative growth and slope stabilization.

# Capital Improvement Plan Compiled by Village Administrator Jason Tubaugh As Adopted at Regular Meeting of March 28, 2018

## Water Line Replacement and Paving Projects:

Phase I- Second Street in between Carrollton Street and Eastport Street in 2017 (Completed)

The Village will purchase the material and bid the labor work to a local contractor.

<u>Phase II</u> - Second Street from Eastport to Custer Way alley to encompass all cross streets such as School House junction and Masonic Way, projected date 2019 for initial planning and cost assessment - engineering and grant possibilities for upgraded line from a four inch to a six inch line

Phase III- Proposed engineering and grant feasibility for Eastport Street

This would encompass the intersection of SR 151 (Main Street) and Eastport to the intersection of Carrollton Street 2020

Phase IV- Maple and Wainut Street 2021

Engineering and grant proposal for upgrading from a 4 inch main line to a 6 inch main line for proper fire coverage and removal of any lead joints, fixtures, and service lines.

Phase V- Eastport Street

Eastport from the intersection of West College St. to the intersection of Crimm Road 2022-2023

Engineering services and grant possibilities, move the existing four inch water line to the sidewalk area and replace it with a new six inch line - replace any fire hydrants that are needed.

<u>Phase VI</u>- Brown Street / Elm Street / Grandview Street from West College St. to the village limit at Cemetery Road Replace existing line with new C900 plastic - repave as needed Proposed for 2024

#### Lift Station Upgrades:

#### East Port Lift Station

New T6 pump 2017

Proposed second new T6 pump installation in 2019 with new control panel and instruments, well casing inspection

#### College Lift Station

New T6 pump purchase and install in 2018 [\$14,000 purchase price has already been approved]
Proposed second new T6 pump installation in 2020 with new control panel and well casing inspection

#### Church St Lift Station

Currently up to specs / Recommend in 2025 a possible overhaul if needed of existing equipment

#### Water Treatment Plant

- -Filter media Recommend testing on filter media in 2025 to assess its expected shelf life
- -Well #1 and #2 Well cleaning and assessment of pumps and associated equipment to be conducted per manufacturer's guidelines in 2026 (every 7-10 years)
- -Aerator. Tanks, and surface pumps Condition assessment, maintenance, and service life inspection in summer of 2023 (every 5 years)
- -Water Storage Tank Inspection and cleaning required in 2022 (every 5 years per EPA guidelines)
- -EZ chemical pumps- Inspected, repaired or replaced every 12 months (estimated cost \$680 per pump) The WTP will have 4 pumps in service and 4 spares on hand
- -Schedule 80 pipe-Plumbing is rated for 40 year life span at 120 PSI, inspect annually
- -Additional equipment and inspections will be required with the upgrade project in 2018
